Stanley 1st Lateral # 2 Smooth Plane

I have my own thoughts about Stanley No2 typing. Its not scientific but does apply common sense and logic. I think Stanley changed to the type 4 frog seat on No2 planes in 1872.and continued using the "J" cutters through the 1870's. At the same time they changed the "Y" yoke from a round tip to the present style. There are a lot of these types with the smooth frog seat that do not have the 71 cast in the bed behind the frog. I believe these are the type 3 No2 planes. When



Stanley ran out of these casting and went to another foundry to have new castings made, the new casting for the No2's had the "71" cast into the bed and became the type 4 as indicated in JW's book. Stanley was renown for using every bit of their stock and weren't

concerned about TYPES when they were putting planes together. I'm sure some of the castings with the "71" carried over into the type 5 first lateral No2's along with the cutters with the "J" logo. When Stanley ran out of cutters with the "J" logo later type 5 planes were fitted with cutters with the "P" logo and new castings did not have the "71" cast into the bed. Do to the fact that type 5 No2 Stanley's are a scarce as hens teeth I don't thinks they were in production for very long Like I stated when I started these are just some of the conclusions I have come to after examining hundreds of No2 Stanley planes.

AUCTION REPORT

While it was still fresh in my mind, I sat down and wrote the following about an auction I attended in Paw Paw Michigan (Aug. 21, 2003). The one small ad I saw for the sale listed some very nice Stanley planes including Nos. 2, 2c, all the bench planes from 2 thru 8, 10, 10-1/2, 11, 12, etc., etc. What the ad did not state was that there were multiples of most of these and hundreds of box lots of bench planes, wrenches, saws, drills, braces and just about ever other type of tool imaginable.

This sale was held for the estate of the Thom Brothers, but the few people there who knew the family say the tools were hoarded by one brother, and the other brother didn't even know what was in the building until after his brother died. Apparently he collected or hoarded other things too, as there was soon to follow a 2-day toy auction and a 2-day fishing collectibles auction. There had already been a sale of the coins. One of the auctioneers said when they first entered the house, coins were piled high on every flat surface inside.

There were many rare and unusual tools including a Hotchkiss Patent (May 4, 1852) quick adjusting nut wrench that sold to a tool dealer and longtime wrench collector from New York. This same buyer also purchased an old Duplex saw that had a blade with teeth on both top and bottom edges and a handle that was symmetrical to either cutting edge. It featured a big medallion with an eagle on it. A fist full of odd quick adjusting wrenches sold to a Michigan flea marketeer for \$550. An ebony plow with ivory tips that needed some work went for \$1800 and an absolutely gorgeous "A. Stanley" No. 26 rule sold for \$900.

Yours truly made off with a breast drill I've only seen once before. It's a ratcheting model made by Millers Falls that has a stock that can be removed and reattached in a socket so that the stock and breast plate are at 90% to the rest of the drill. It cost \$25. I also got a fist full of unusual quick adjusting nut wrenches for \$250, a box full of other odd wrenches for \$60, two Bedrock 608 planes for \$100 & \$125, a box full of drills and braces for \$60, another box lot of bench planes including two early Bedrocks for \$100, a very nice Winchester block plane for \$100, Keen Kutter bit set in original box \$80, and many other odds and ends.

The auctioneers had set up a big shade tent just outside the big building where most of the tools had been stored. Under the tent were about 16 to 18 tables. The inner ring of tables were filled with the 260 numbered lots, and the outer ring of tables held box lots. Inside the building were another 30 or so tables filled with box lots of every size and description. They began by selling the first table full of numbered lots. When that was sold they allowed the crowd to pull items from the box lots in the outer ring and put them on the empty table. These items were then sold followed by the next table of numbered lots and so on. By about noon, all the numbered lots had been sold and they were working on box lots with just a few items being held up and sold individually.

There was one box containing four or five Stanley 112 scraper planes and two or three number 10 rabbet planes that sold for about \$350. Other box lots of more common bench or block planes were selling in the \$25 to \$50 range.

This sale was one of the best I've attended from a buyers perspective for the sheer number of tools and from the number of very rare or unusual items that turned up in it. It was clear that Mr. Thom had hoarded for many years.

Tom Witte, who lives just two or three miles from the auction site, was contacted to "advise" the auctioneers. In my opinion, if they paid Tom to catalog this sale and had they held it indoors over a two or three day period, this sale would easily have netted the estate another \$25,000 to \$50,000 or more.
